Contemporary Native American art will also be discussed. Comparisons between individual Native American cultures will be drawn, as well as comparisons between Native and Eurocentric cultures.

The Nutrition Education certificate program focuses on the concepts of food literacy and health and wellness. It is designed for students interested in the nutrients in food along with their actions within the body, issues of nutrition status across the lifespan, and the impact of food choices on one's health, the environment, and the economy. Students can choose the direction of their studies by selecting course(s) that include the following areas: food preparation, performance nutrition, nutrition and aging, lifespan nutrition, or early childhood education.

After completing the classes for this certificate, students may apply credits toward the Associate in Science in Nutrition and Dietetics for Transfer (AS-T).

### **Program Student Learning Outcomes**

Upon completion of this program, the student will be able to:

- Correlate dietary intake to weight management, sports performance, chronic diseases, and hunger.
- Apply the scientific method to biological problems, and interpret scientific data in a reasonable manner.
- Assess the various sources of nutrition information and demonstrate where to find reliable nutrition information.
- Compare and contrast nutrient, caloric, and food requirements at all stages of the life cycle.
- Describe ethnicity, ethnocentrism, and racism and analyze the impact of these on food habits and communication in the United States.
- Assemble molecules demonstrating an understanding of chemical bonding and molecular structure to predict their chemical behavior.

- Complete a minimum of 60 semester or 90 quarter units of CSU transferable coursework.
- Have an overall GPA of 2.0 in CSU transferable courses.
- Are in good standing at the last college or university attended.
- Complete 30 semester or 45 quarter units of CSU transferable general education courses (CSU GE or IGETC) with a grade of C minus or better. These courses must include the following:
  - CSU GE Breadth areas: A1, A2, A3 and B4 or
  - IGETC areas: 1A, 1B, 1C and 2A

### Special Notes for CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY SACRAMENTO:

1. CSU Sacramento requires three units to meet their Race and Ethnicity Graduation requirement. The following FLC courses meet this requirement: ADMJ 302, COMM 325, PSYC 368 and SOC 321. These courses can also meet CSU General Education Certification requirements.
2. Students with catalog rights of Fall 1992 or later must meet the Foreign Language Requirement. It can be met by any one of the following:
  - complete of 3 years of the same foreign language in high school with a grade of C- or better
  - graduate from a secondary School where the language of instruction was not English
  - Score 3, 4 or 5 on a foreign language AP test
  - Complete 2 semesters of a foreign language at a community college or university with a grade of 'C-' or better
  - Students pursuing a **BS** in the following majors are exempt from this requirement: Business Administration: *all concentrations*; Chemistry: *BS only*; Computer Science: *all concentrations*; Construction Management; Engineering: *all concentrations*; Health Sciences: *all concentrations*; Kinesiology: *Athletic Training and Exercise Science concentrations*; Nursing: *all concentrations*; Physics: *BS only*; Recreation: *all concentrations*.
3. Students with catalog rights of Fall 1992 or later must complete CSUS's English 20. The following FLC courses meet this requirement for CSU Sacramento: **ENGWR 301 & 302**. These courses also meet the AREA A#3 requirement on the CSU General Education Pattern.

### CSU GE for STEM:

- Area 4: 6 units with 2 courses from 2 different disciplines.

**Minimum Requirements to transfer to a University of California (UC) campus with Junior Standing:**

- Complete 60 semester (90 quarter) units of UC transferable coursework with a GPA of at least 2.4 (2.8 if you are a nonresident). No more than 14 semester or 21 quarter units may be taken Pass/No Pass.
- Complete the following course pattern requirements, earning a grade of 'C' or better in each course:
  - Two UC transferable college courses (3 semester or 4-5 quarter units) in English composition. Courses from IGETC areas 1A and 1B fulfill this requirement.
  - One UC transferable college course (3 semester or 4-5 quarter units) in mathematical concepts and quantitative reasoning. Courses from IGETC area 2A fulfill this requirement.
  - Four UC transferable college courses (3 semester or 4-5 quarter units each) chosen from at least two of the following subject areas. Courses from IGETC areas 3, 4, & 5 and other UC transferable courses fulfill this requirement.
    - Arts and Humanities - courses approved for IGETC areas 3A and 3B meet this requirement
    - Social and Behavioral Sciences – courses approved for IGETC area 4 meet this requirement
    - Physical and Biological Sciences- courses approved for IGETC areas 5A, 5B & 5C meet this requirement
  - Keep in mind that meeting these requirements does not guarantee admission to the campus or major of your choice. Many campuses and majors receive more applications than they have spaces available. To be competitive, you should work toward meeting the specific requirements for your preferred campuses and majors.
  - Be sure to use [www.assist.org](http://www.assist.org) to ensure that every course you take is UC transferable and helps you make progress towards your transfer goals.
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**Minimum requirements to transfer to a California State University (CSU) campus with Junior Standing:**

- Complete 60 semester (90 quarter) CSU transferable units. It helps to complete lower division major requirements. These requirements are available at [www.assist.org](http://www.assist.org).
- Have an overall GPA of 2.0 in CSU transferable courses
- Complete at least 30 semester units of CSU General Education (CSU GE or IGETC) requirements with a grade of C minus or better. These must include the following:
  - CSU GE Breadth areas: A1, A2, A3 and B4 or
  - IGETC areas IA, IB, IC and 2A
  - Be in good standing at the last college or university you attended.

**It is important to make an appointment with your FLC Counselor to have your IGETC certified prior to transferring!**
